2. Background

Po Leung Kuk Camões Tan Siu Lin Primary School was previously known as Portuguese Community Schools, Inc., Escola Camões. It was established in the 1950s by the Portuguese Community Education and Welfare Foundation Incorporated.

Since 1996, the School has been run by Po Leung Kuk - the leading charitable organization and fundraiser of Hong Kong founded in 1878. In line with the economic growth of Hong Kong society over the past decade, the service of Po Leung Kuk had evolved from initially helping the children and women into benefiting the well-being of local public as a whole. In reflecting and meeting the needs of our society, Po Leung Kuk has succeeded in providing quality education service for the public on a non-profit making basis.

The educational service of Po Leung Kuk places a strong focus on balanced learning - morality, intelligence, physical integrity, unity and aesthetics. The curriculum can respond quickly to the latest changes and developments locally and internationally, challenging the students to have an informed view of the current issues and events that affect our world. With such vision of flexibility in mind, in the school year 2000/2001, our school has become a pioneer Direct Subsidy Scheme (DSS) primary school in Hong Kong.

Like our sponsoring body, we have no political or religious persuasions in our schools. In the belief that everyone should be able to equally enjoy freedom of expression and religion, we allow that all schools of thought and all religions can co-exist in school with no discrimination or prejudice. Our students are actively encouraged to participate in volunteering work in order to foster a sense of social responsibility to the community.

3. School Facilities

Our school campus is comprised of three buildings (Main Building, Music Complex and Sports Complex) and four covered playgrounds. In the Main Building built in 1999, there are 32 conventional classrooms, a school hall, an art room, a computer room and sports climbing facilities. In the Music Complex built in 2007, there are two orchestra rehearsal rooms, two music rooms, seven piano rooms, an art room, a campus TV studio, a multi-media language centre, special rooms, a theatre and a library. The Sport Complex built in 2022 includes an all-weather indoor swimming pool and the Heart Space (a mindfulness room). All these facilities cater for the diverse needs of the school curriculum and the whole-person development of students.

4. School Vision & Mission

Education is about nurturing the whole child - our school embraces development of the child in the moral, intellectual, physical, social and aesthetic spheres. Developing children's potential to the fullest is an overriding aim of our school. Our school is committed to providing a caring, harmonious and stimulating environment where children are joyful and secure enough to be able to work to the best of their ability.

5. School Management

The School management is supervised by a board of Incorporated Management Committee (IMC) which includes members from sponsoring body (Po Leung Kuk), the Principal, teachers, parents, alumni and the public.

6. Class Organization

Po Leung Kuk Camões Tan Siu Lin Primary School is a whole day co-educational English primary school under the Direct Subsidy Scheme. There are 5 classes for each class level from P1 to P6, with a total of 30 classes and a total enrolment of 885 as of 29 September 2023. The maximum class size for P1 is 33. To cater for students' different learning needs, flexible teaching and learning strategies such as co-teaching and split classes are adopted for different subjects and class levels. In such cases, the class size may approximately range from 12 to 25 per lesson.

(3) Achievements and Reflection on Major Concerns; Feedback and Follow-up

• Major Concern 1: To enhance students' physical and mental well-being

Achievements

- > To strengthen students' physical health through swimming lessons and body fitness programmes
 - Swimming lessons were conducted across all grade levels to enhance water safety skills
 throughout the year. In addition, paid sports interest classes, such as Stand Up Paddle
 Boarding, SUP Yoga, Open Water Scuba Diving, Snorkeling, and Kayaking were offered to
 students.
 - To promote physical activity, two sports corners were established in the School Hall and Student Activity Centre during recess, where students actively participated and reached the maximum permitted quota. Activities including juggling, skipping, badminton, and table tennis were introduced to arouse students' interest in sports. The school's internal annual fitness test was conducted and more than half of the students (541 students) got awards in the test.

> To equip students with better emotion management skills

- Class teachers and PE teachers taught our P.1 to P.6 students the skills and techniques of
 doing breathing exercises to help themselves relieve stress and anxiety. More than 10
 practices were done by the classes. PE teachers and other subject teachers agreed that
 students were calmer after doing breathing exercises. Students have formed a habit of doing
 breathing exercises after each PE lesson, thereby helping them mentally to get ready for the
 next lesson.
- A range of mindfulness and emotion management programs were delivered to support students' mental well-being. The Paws b Mindfulness Curriculum was implemented in P.3 Personal Growth Education lessons to develop students' emotional awareness and proper values. Conducted in the Heart Space with an extra qualified teacher, the program enhanced student support.
- Students from lower and upper classes utilized the T.A.B. (Take a Break Room) during recess for sharing their feelings, allowing early identification of those in need of support. Various mindfulness activities, such as colouring, stretching, and mindful jar-making were conducted with 10-15 students per session, helping them develop healthy habits and emotional skills.
- The topics of PGE were modified based on values such as unity and perseverance. Themes of the civil talks and PGE lessons echoed with the School Year Theme and the core values of the School. Various talks and sharing sessions were organized to address topics such as stress management and emotional intelligence, which were well-received by both students and parents. Group activities such as the Fun in Art Workshop and the Caring Friends Workshop helped students develop emotional control, interpersonal relationships, and problem-solving skills, benefiting students in building resilience and managing interpersonal challenges. Nine P.4-5 mindfulness ambassadors assisted throughout the year, promoting peer support.
- The P.3 sweet corn growing scheme fostered values like responsibility and perseverance, with students self-evaluating their attitudes and earning value stickers for their performance. Additionally, 180 students were recognized as "Student of the Month", reinforcing positive behaviour, and the discipline campaign motivated students to adhere to classroom regulations.

Reflection

> Very positive feedback from students and teachers was received. Many parents appreciated the focus on swimming lessons, as it provided an essential life skill while promoting fitness. Students also enjoyed having different activities in Paw b Mindfulness lessons especially in the Heart Space. Students agreed that they learnt ways to stay focused and get back attention during Paws b lessons. Students' physical and mental well being was successfully enhanced through the activities held and arrangements made by our School. The above-mentioned activities and arrangements will be incorporated as routine work.

Feedback and Follow-up

> Other than the activities organized before, new activities will be introduced during recess to encourage students to remain physically active throughout the school day. Teachers will be provided with additional tools and workshops to better support students' emotional well-being. The school will also continue to offer talks and sharing sessions on topics such as stress management and emotional intelligence. Emphasis will be placed on enhancing both parental engagement and teacher training to ensure students receive well-rounded support.

• <u>Major Concern 2: To enhance learning and teaching effectiveness in different learning modalities</u>

Achievements

> To optimize the current teaching practices and effectiveness in blended learning mode

- All subject departments assigned pre-lesson self-directed learning tasks on Google/Flipped Classroom to maximize the effectiveness of class time teaching, so that there was more time for interactive learning activities, discussions and giving feedback to students during lessons.
- Teachers made good use of online learning platforms, various types of self-learning materials which could consolidate students' understanding. For example, in English, students could easily do collaborative tasks on their own electronic devices. They could draft their writing assignments on Google Doc for easy editing, which allowed teachers to give feedback on their work directly via the platform.
- In PE, P.5 and P.6 students began using an online learning platform (Learning Fun) starting from the second term. Students were required to read about sports knowledge either before or after their PE lessons.
- All subject departments upheld the tradition of Subject Weeks during school days and postexam period, students participated in online and offline activities that complemented their blended learning experiences.

> To reinforce students' awareness and encourage self-directed learning in blended learning mode

- As most subject departments maintained the routine of uploading pre-lessons tasks, classwork materials and post-lesson consolidation on Google Classroom, students have developed a habit of checking these materials on their own.
- Teachers used a variety of eLearning tools, such as Padlet, Google Classroom and Quizlet, to facilitate a blended learning environment. All P.5 and P.6 students participated in the BYOD Programme, "Gadget+ Program". The Program further enabled diverse classroom activities, facilitating students' self-directed learning.

- P.6 students continued to participate in the "Self-learning Academy" which promotes self-directed learning skills. This year, an increase in awards was notable. A total of 42 Glass Awards, 20 Crystal Awards and 10 Diamond Awards were presented to those who completed the learning materials well and showed themselves terrific self-directed learners.
- Learning continued beyond school hours with post-lesson consolidation and enrichment: task sheets, games, videos, songs, websites, and learning platforms. For example, in Math, they reported that 90% of students actively participated in Planetii for consolidation exercises. In General Studies, the self-directed online Astronomy Award scheme was carried out for P.1 to P.6 students, with over 80% participation. Students could earn badges by completing tasks, resulting in over 1,000 badges awarded. It was encouraging that most students cared about their own learning and improved on self-directed learning.

Reflection

- The implementation of blended learning and interactive activities has significantly enhanced student engagement and learning effectiveness. Students showed a greater sense of ownership of their learning, particularly through pre-lesson tasks and the use of interactive tools like Google Classroom, Padlet, etc. The different types of experiential learning activities organized in the theme-based subject weeks, namely Chinese Week, English Week, Third Languages Week and STEAM Week, provided students with pleasurable learning beyond the classroom. From the evaluation results, more than 90% of students enjoyed the subject weeks very much. Being able to master and apply what they have learnt, they wanted the subject weeks to be extended and looked forward to similar activities in the future. This indicated that our students were highly interested and motivated in learning. They actively participated in the learning activities within and beyond the classroom. They were provided with ample opportunities to master and apply the knowledge and skills they had learnt, and to take the initiatives to explore and develop their potential.
- ➤ The PE written test conducted at the end of the second term showed encouraging results. Moving forward, the use of the "Learning Fun" online learning platform will expand to P.4 students, and P.4 to P.6 students will continue to use it to enhance their understanding of sports concepts.

Feedback and Follow-up

➤ Many eLearning lessons were conducted in different subjects. Different electronic resources were used, including Padlet, Quizlet, Kahoot, Nearpod, ClassDojo, Google Classroom, apps and platforms provided by publishers. An "eLearning platform summary" was shared for use by all teaching staff. All subject departments agreed to continue to look for other suitable e-platforms, websites and apps to enrich learning and teaching. Teachers will receive training to continue to optimize the use of blended learning tools, ensuring effective implementation.

Major Concern 3: To reinforce staff development

Achievements

> To build individual strengths and explore potential in teachers

- Staff development remained a priority to maintain high-quality education, with workshops focusing on educational technology, classroom management and differentiated instruction. 51 teachers participated in a 3-hour workshop conducted by EDUperience 日常教育. This workshop was designed to enhance teachers' understanding of STEAM education and its application in the classroom. Teachers were introduced to the latest trends in STEAM education and had hands-on experience with two STEAM platforms, Scratch Jr and CoSpaces, learning how to integrate these tools into their lessons.
- Some other teachers participated in a STEAM trip to Dongguan and Shenzhen to learn more about the integration of STEAM education into real classrooms.
- Teachers were assigned administrative duties according to their expertise and interests. They had more chances to learn from the more experienced and senior staff of the School.

> To promote teacher professional development.

- 38 teachers attended a 3-hour seminar organized by Po Leung Kuk. Teachers learnt how to protect students with awareness of potential dangers around through the sharing from four police officers. The topics included were "Drug Situation Involving Students and Anti-Drugs Materials", "Ways to Prevent, Detect, Handle and Report Child Abuse Cases", "It's Everybody's Business If It's a Scam, Remind the People Around You!" and "Understanding Cyber Pitfalls".
- A School Crisis Management workshop was held, 66 Chinese-speaking teachers participated in a 3-hour workshop led by the 保良局學生輔導及支援服務「子在成長」SEEDs 計劃. Teachers achieved understanding of the handling procedures in school crisis management and the roles of teachers and crisis management team members. A serious case study was also carried out. In groups, teachers role-played different personnel involved when a crisis happened. It was a fruitful experience for all.
- 10 Non-Chinese-speaking teachers participated in a 2-hour workshop conducted by 劉寶凌 註冊社工 from the Hong Kong Federation of Education Workers (香港教育工作者聯會). Teachers learnt how to identify students at risk, how to handle emergencies with care, and what prevention could be done to help students at risk. Teachers had active discussions and case studies and were inspired by the guest speaker's generous sharing of her counselling experience.

Reflection

> The workshops and seminars provided valuable insights into various aspects of teaching, including STEAM education and crisis management. Teachers expressed that hands-on experiences and practical applications were particularly beneficial. The participation rates were encouraging, showing a strong interest in professional growth among staff. However, some teachers mentioned that they would appreciate additional support as they worked to implement the new strategies they learnt in their classrooms.

Feedback and Follow-up

> The School will focus on providing more practical and structured training sessions. Continued collaboration with organizations like Po Leung Kuk and EDUperience will be sought to provide further professional development opportunities. In addition, mentoring opportunities will continue to be developed to support new teachers and enhance their transition into the school environment. To facilitate teachers to enrol in courses, seminars and workshops to enrich their professional knowledge, updated information of such was provided through Weekly Memo for teachers' reference. The School Principal strongly advised teachers to continue to develop their professionalism to meet the new educational reforms and challenges. Teachers were also reminded to input their records of professional development on the e-services Portal. The records were found to be more systematic and updated. This would help the school to conduct review of staff development needs in the future. Compared with the previous school year, more teachers attended talks, seminars, workshops and took short courses to further equip themselves.

(4) Student Performance

> Students' Academic Performance

Our students performed well in the internal assessments in 2023/2024. The result of SSPA was very satisfactory (Appendix I). Our School is not connected to any secondary schools. 87.5% of the P.6 students chose to take the offers from DSS secondary schools or succeeded in securing a place in the DP stage. Only 12.5% of the P.6 students joined the Central Allocation and 36% of them were allocated their first choice. After the post allocation stage, more than 78% of our students decided to take the DSS places as their final offers.

> Students' Participation and Achievements in ECA

We always encourage our students to work hard and play hard. During 2023-2024, weekly ECA was conducted from Oct 2023. There were approximately 20 lessons for each ECA this school year. We provided different courses for students to cooperate and communicate with one another in order to build up a sense of team spirit. More than 90% of students were satisfied with the ECA classes. School team training was conducted for the whole year. Over 1700 awards were achieved in different open competitions this year.

Post-exam activities were conducted from 25 June to 12 July 2024. They included different competitions, the 25th Anniversary Musical and Concert, Art Exhibition, art workshop, PTA Little Chef, movie appreciation, sex education and cyber safety talks, etc. Participation in these activities helped develop students' potential and enhance their self-confidence, independence, perseverance, endurance, teamwork and sportsmanship during their primary school life. We believe that these qualities are the key for success for their future. Evaluation from teachers reflected that students did enjoy the activities and the arrangements were fine.

> Students' Participation and Achievements in Inter-School & Open/International Competitions

In 2023/24, over 600 students participated in different open competitions, such as HK Schools Speech Festival, Music Festival, Asian English Usage Contest, etc. They received over 1700 awards, including 95 regional or international prizes outside Hong Kong, 1520 territorial awards and 124 district awards within Hong Kong. Most of them received at least 2 prizes. Highlights of Students' Award Lists attached are in Appendix II.

> School teams/uniform groups/community service

Students were encouraged to serve the School and community by engaging in diverse activities. They got a better understanding of the needs of others.

- (i) In 2023-24, there were a total of 66 school teams, including music, sports, visual arts, Tour Guides, Student MC Teams, etc.
- (ii) P.4 Happy Servers was organised by the Pastoral Care Team with the help of class teachers and the school social worker. All P.4 students did a distant voluntary service to celebrate Christmas with the elderly. They prepared goody bags (independent masks, towel, and biscuits), drew a Christmas card and designed a bag. Videos of performance and goody bags by each class were sent to the elderly centre before Christmas to share the joy and spread love and care. Self-evaluation showed that service targets, teachers and students gave positive feedback.
- (iii) On 14 August 2024 (Wednesday), over 240 of our students, accompanied by their parents, participated in the Po Leung Kuk Flag Selling Fundraising Day. Selling flags is a meaningful parent-child charitable activity. Children enjoyed the company, guidance and care of their parents when they sold flags on the street. At the same time, they also learnt how to ask for a request boldly. The most important thing was that they cultivated a caring heart about the disadvantaged in the community and understood that "it is more blessed to give than to receive".

> Students' Physical Well-being

For reference, the report issued by Department of Health (Student Health Service) in June 2024 reflected the analysis on students' overweight and obesity problems for 2022/23 as follows:

It was noted that the percentage of the overweight (including obesity) of students did not exceed the overall percentage of all schools. The School will continue to promote healthy eating habits and regular physical exercises, and support to establish a healthy school environment so that students will put into practice a healthy living style.

> Enriching school life through large-scale school events/activities

Students enriched their school life by actively taking the roles as participants, performers, and helpers and leaders in school events/activities such as Subject Weeks (English, Chinese, Third Languages & STEAM), Thanksgiving 360°, School Picnic, Christmas Party, Sports Day, Art Exhibition, Graduation Camp, Annual Concert and Musical Drama. Comments from teachers and students were good.

As regards Open Day, we celebrated our 25th Anniversary with the theme 'Homecoming'. This year's Open Day, scheduled on 27 April 2024, was a resounding success. Over 10,400 visitors experienced the vibrant atmosphere of our campus. A special highlight was our 25th Anniversary Commemorative Exhibition, presenting our school's remarkable journey over the past quartercentury, uniting teachers, parents, alumni and students in celebration.
